Gordon & Chris Hay



AYC's Mega Zoom General Meeting!

On May 8th a historic first for AYC; we held a Mega "Zoom" General Meeting! Undaunted by the coronavirus, the club improvised using the technologies we have available and gathered together for a virtual meeting. The session was very well attended with close to 47 screens on-line. John Sanford, in his role of Vice Commodore, kicked off the meeting, covering some Zoom basics for the crowd and made the announcement that Wednesday Night Racing was back. Tim Wenger, the Race Chairman, clarified that only the "on the water" activities have resumed; with crew limitations to follow Skagit County's Health Department guidelines.



John invited two terrific speakers to address the crowd. First off, was Jeanne Goussev, Captain for Team "Sail Like A Girl". Jeanne and her crew introduced us to their team, and shared their adventures with us in pictures and movies during the 2018 and 2019 R2AK (Race to Alaska). In 2018, "Sail Like A Girl", a Melges 32', was the winner and the first mono-hull, and the first all-women crew, to win this rigorous 700 mile "Iditarod of the Sea" event. In 2019, they placed fourth overall, behind our own AYC sailor Lars Strandberg on Broderna; as it turns out. Jeanne's passion is to inspire women to strive for positions of leadership on boats and to grow awareness of getting more women out on the water. She has turned her passion in to a cause and formed the "Sail Like A Girl" 501(C)(3) foundation to sponsor events for women sailors throughout the Puget Sound.
